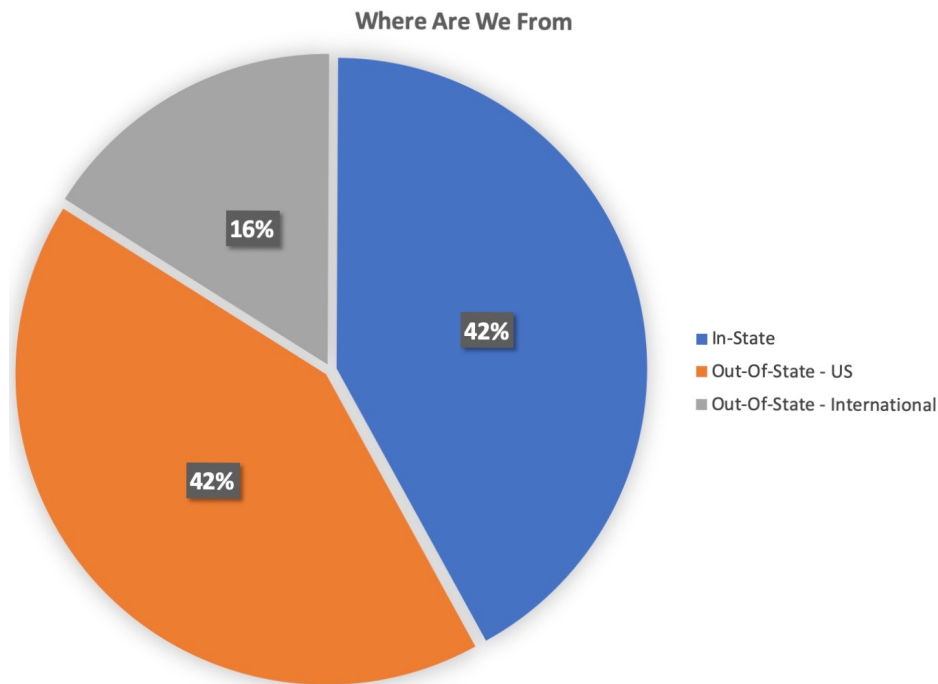

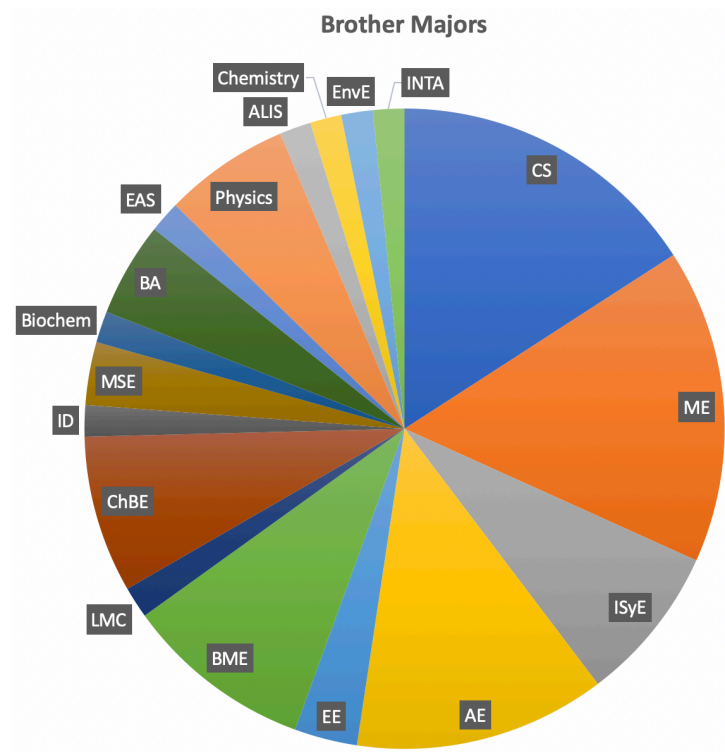
Chapter Updates
